In all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make straight your paths. How can we here at Fowler UMC move toward more inclusion and belonging while letting go of the outcome thus spending more time concentrating on the journey we are on? What changes in attitude and action are needed to change the prevailing landscape?

After talking to people with disabilities about this question, they, of course, had many recommendations, however, they emphasized nine primary actions:

- Advocating: Speaking up regarding accessibility needs and calling upon the congregation to respond
- **2. Reflecting**: Regularly examining all aspects of congregational life to identify areas of existing accessibility and pressing need
- **3. Asking**: Inviting the perspectives and preferences of people with disabilities regarding accessibility and inclusion
- **4. Researching**: Seeking out the expertise and experiences of others from outside of the congregation (e.g., disability organizations, self-advocates)
- **5. Equipping**: Increasing the capacity and commitment of church members to support inclusion
- **6. Embracing**: Adopting a posture or culture that values people with disabilities and recognizes their gifts
- **7. Proacting**: Taking active and advanced steps to welcome and include people with disabilities
- **8. Including**: Weaving and welcoming people with disabilities within all aspects of congregational life
- **9. Praying**: Seeking guidance and support from God in all these endeavors (Erik W. Carter, Professor-Vanderbilt University PMB 228, Peabody College)

How are we doing here at Fowler with these thoughts/ideas? Are we hearing them? Are we putting them into action? Which ones are we missing, and which ones are we doing well? I believe that self-reflection is so important on our journey. It will take a village and God's blessing to make this happen...join us on June the 8th, 6:00 pm here at the church for our next NewDay meeting, please invite someone with a heart for people with disabilities or someone with a disability who may want to let their voice be heard while we are traveling together on this particular part of our journey.


