Greetings, Fowler Family, as you are reading this letter I am making my final preparations for bringing closure to my time here as your music coordinator. Ten years ago I was called upon because you were in need of a pianist. I felt the call to re-enter music ministry and from that seed you helped enable me to articulate 10 years of wonderful music ministry. Together we reestablished our chancel choir under the tremendous direction of Dottie Godley and Jim Brown on the organ. Pastor Glenn, our worship committee led by Laurie Newell, and our Fowler musicians offered many years of special worship services: Christmas Eve, Ash Wednesday, Maundy Thursday/Good Friday, Pentecost Sunday, just to name a few. And when the opportunity to have our very own set of marimbas be built by Washington builders you said an enthusiastic, "Yes!." From there we began a few years of a music outreach program that served our community as we met on Thursday afternoons to rehearse marimba and drum music. And with the pastoral transition you were right behind Rene' and I as we re-aligned music with more of a "band feel."
