The moving date has finally arrived when Caritas relocates to 1228 W. Nebraska from its' previous location at W. Dalke. The new location will begin to operate starting on June 2. The regular hours are Mon/Wed/Thur 11:00 am – 1 pm. Caritas continues to assist Fowler UMC and about a dozen other northwest Spokane churches along with their little food pantrys/cupboards that spread love and caring to our nearby neighbors. Recently one side door of the Fowler food cupboard located in front of the church was broke. Caritas has a volunteer that will fix this for us. Thank you Caritas!

The new location on 1228 W. Nebraska has needed quite a bit of refurbishing and alterations. New flooring, electrical work, painting, shelving, new ramp, and other changes were accomplished. Some of this was covered with grant money but the expenses of moving are many. As always, your donations, prayers, and volunteer work are welcome. The Caritas volunteers are a great bunch of Christian folks to work with!
