# Pastoral News

As we move into this new phase of ministry at Fowler UMC, Pastor Rene' and I are learning all we can about best practices, and want to keep you in the loop. This past week we met with pastors of two congregations that offer disability-inclusive worship. Their top advice: focus on being welcoming, and don't forget the caregivers!

We want everything we do to communicate welcome, which includes things we are already doing such as:

Having a friendly greeter at the door and hospitable people in the sanctuary.

Installing pew cutouts in multiple locations so everyone has a place to sit with those they come with.

Printing, projecting, and explaining the order of worship and prayers. You may have noticed the new icons which help non-readers keep track of the service.

The number one thing we are doing to create welcome is the sensory space in the narthex. When a caregiver for someone who experiences sensory overload sees this space

as they first enter the church they will know we are taking this ministry seriously! This space will be used by individuals who may find the music a little loud, or are unable to stay seated and focused on the service – that could be any of us! It is also available if you are trying to distance when recovering from a cough that persists or are leaving worship early to set up coffee hour.

However, our sensory space is designed primarily for people with sensory processing differences who may have a low tolerance of bright lights, loud sounds, strong scents, or even unfamiliar movement. These differences are commonly experienced by people on the autism spectrum. The activities in this space will help people using it to regulate their sensory systems and gain calm and focus. Participants in the back can still hear the service and see it through the windows, even if the curtain in the middle is pulled out to divide the space into two sections. For some, being in this space might be the first step into being able to be part of the full worship service. This may also the first time they have heard the good news that God loves all of us, just as we are!

Sensory-regulating activities will include a variety of tactile and manipulative experiences attached to the sensory wall that is under construction on the back side of the new shelf unit. Weighted blankets and lap pads along with bean bag seats and an inflatable canoe-shaped seat will offer compression. If someone is overwhelmed and needs a full sensory break there will be a small tent and a padded alcove that looks like a cave. Smaller tactile and weighted items, along with noise-reducing headphones, can easily be taken into worship. That's why the bins containing these items face the sanctuary.


Welcoming measures we can pay increasing attention to:

Having a variety of food available whenever food is served that meets different dietary needs, and marking it as such: gluten-free, lactose free, nut-free, etc.! We want to offer equivalent food items so that no one feels left out. Remember that there may be participants who have trouble chewing and might want softer food.

Limiting our use of scented hygiene and laundry products and avoiding fragrances.

Not assuming that guests are familiar with any part of worship or the way we do things! We were all new once, and we need to remember how that felt.
