The Parable of the Good Samaritan

25 Just then a lawyer stood up to test Jesus. 'Teacher,' he said, 'what must I do to inherit eternal life?' ²⁶He said to him, 'What is written in the law? What do you read there?' ²⁷He answered, 'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength, and with all your mind; and your neighbour as yourself.' ²⁸And he said to him, 'You have given the right answer; do this, and you will live.'

29 But wanting to justify himself, he asked Jesus, 'And who is my neighbour?' ³⁰Jesus replied, 'A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, and fell into the hands of robbers, who stripped him, beat him, and went away, leaving him half dead. ³¹Now by chance a priest was going down that road; and when he saw him, he passed by on the other side. ³²So likewise a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him, passed by on the other side. ³³But a Samaritan while travelling came near him; and when he saw him, he was moved with pity. ³⁴He went to him and bandaged his wounds, having poured oil and wine on them. Then he put him on his own animal, brought him to an inn, and took care of him. ³⁵The next day he took out two denarii, gave them to the innkeeper, and said, "Take care of him; and when I come back, I will repay you whatever more you spend." ³⁶Which of these three, do you think, was a neighbour to the man who fell into the hands of the robbers?' ³⁷He said, 'The one who showed him mercy.' Jesus said to him, 'Go and do likewise.'

Lots of talk behind the scenes...thought I need to put in my two cents...to defend those who want to be part of a church willing to love and be open and affirming.





Bible -

Christians are believed to have massacred more followers of Jesus than any other group or nation.




Can the Church be wrong?

ROMANS 1 Abandoning what is Natural

Traditional interpretation used to Clobber gay people

PASSAGE RECAP

Paul describes both men and women who turned their back on God and exchanged natural relations for unnatural ones.

JUSTIFICATION FOR DISCRIMINATION

- Used as Biblical support for labeling homosexuality as "unnatural."
- Homosexuality is a broken state that is a result of people turning their backs on God and chasing their own desires.

"The males traded natural sexual relations with females and burned with lust for each other." -Romans 1:27

Why that's a misuse of this passage

RIPPED OUT OF CONTEXT

- These two verses are part of a larger thing Paul was doing in Romans 1, which was part of a larger thing he was doing with the letter altogether: attempting to **unify** Jewish and Gentile Christians in Rome.
- expose Jewish prejudice against Gentiles and level the playing field, so as to bring everyone together.

NOT PAUL'S PERSPECTIVE

homosexuality. He borrowed rhetoric from common Jewish sources which were originally written to be anti-Gentile.

How to UnClobber it. A better way forward

RESTORE INTENT

- This clobber passage was part of a larger effort from Paul to unify Christians in Rome who were fractured along ethnic lines.
- We have to know why Paul wrote Romans (to bring unity) or we'll never understand these two verses. A simple reading isn't enough.

OWNING PREJUDICE

- The church needs to bring to the surface its long-held prejudice against LGBTQ individuals.
- Once named/owned we can repent
 & begin efforts for reconciliation.

FUN FACT:

Early church fathers interpreted Paul's "unnatural sex" to be sex-acts that were non-procreative (not "same-sex" acts).

"In a tragic twist, these words—originally written to unify two fractured groups—have been misused to justify the division between the church and the LGBTQ community."

Know ye not that the unrighteous shall not inherit yhe kingdom of God? Be not deceived: neither fornicators, nor idolaters, nor adulterers, nor effeminate, nor abusers of themselves with mankind, nor thieves, nor covetous, nor drunkards, nor revilers, nor extortioners, shall inherit the kingdom of God.

So, let us look at those words, and the number of times each it talked about in the bible, and might that tell us something of value?

Fornicators = 67 occurrences (A person who has sex with someone who they are not married to)

Idolaters 41 Bible Verses

Adulterers 40 times

'Effeminate' 25 times in the bible

"Abusers of themselves with mankind" (Male prostitutes or perverts)

Sodomites 55 times (Nothing to do with Sodom and Gomorrah)

Thieves 39 Bible verses

Greediness/Covetous 70 times (70 Major Bible Verses about Greed and Money (Materialism))

Drunkard = more than 70 + times

Reviling others 25 Occurrences

Extortioners/Robbers same as Thieves? (See above)

Gossip = 32

All those words are used so many more times than the concept of Homosexuality why? Could it be because they are more important to God than being gay or transgender? And if it is so important why did Jesus not ever talk about it?

know that the unrighteous will nod? Do not be deceived; neither the dulterers, nor homosexuals, 10 nod unkards, nor revilers, nor swindle? God. 11 And such were some of you are sanctified, you were justified in the ist and by the Spirit of our God.

The Word Homosexuality:

Those who "practice homosexuality" will not inherit the Kingdom of God. The translation there is odd, in part because the word homosexual didn't even exist until more than 1,800 years after the bible was written.

The first appearance of the word "homosexual" in an English translation of the Bible was placed in 1 Corinthians 6:9 by translators of the Revised Standard Version in 1946

The RSV committee decided the word "homosexual" was an inaccurate translation of malakoi and arsenokoitai in 1 Corinthians 6:9 and replaced it with "sexual perverts."

An example of "sexual perverts" would be a dirty old man exposing himself to children on a playground. The RSV team admitted that the Greek word arsenokoital was not condemning homosexuals, but instead those who were abusive in their pursuit of sexual encounters.



Historical context of Paul's time

The historical context shows that pederasty, sex with slaves, temple prostitution and other abusive forms of sex were prevalent in the first century when the Apostle Paul wrote 1 Corinthians. Even though the Bible contains six verses that appear to condemn homosexual activity, it contains more than 200 verses that condemn heterosexual activity. So as researchers it is important for us to determine the type of homosexual or heterosexual activity being condemned.

My Personal experiences

Gay couple in my band in Texas, lived in fear every time a new pastor came, because they may have to give up their family, friends and ministries. They were the most loving, devoted, giving, faithful people I have ever known. It was obvious to me and our congregation that their ministry was and is blessed by God.

Young man was kicked out of his church in which he grew up in for being transgender. After a while his mom talked him into coming to our church. He was just in tears, telling me he thought God did not love him anymore and he would never be welcomed into church again. Broke my heart, that's what the church is doing when we cannot love and accept our neighbors...so sad, is that what Jesus want us to do?

In my Opinion: Being Gay or Lesbian or Transgender or LGBTQIA+ is not a sin.

It is my hope and my prayer that you may have had a chance to hear a different side to the argument...maybe just maybe this has created a little doubt in your mind...and maybe just maybe the love you carry in your heart is wanting to reach out a little further...
